He has made himself dear to our hearts by actively reaching out to engage us in conversation, even trying to help us learn a little Swahili. As you can read, his English is quite good.

"My name is Latiael Mungure. I was born in 1972 at Sakila Village in Arusha Region. I got married in 1999 and I have four children. My first born is Harrison, 9 year old. Second born is Raymond, 6 years old. Third born is Enendy, 3 yrs old and the youngest is Catherine, 8 months. I was employed at this school since 2000. Therefore I have been as a teacher on the Kindergarten post for 8 years now.

"The school management is good, in our school the management is well conducted from our sponsors to our General Manager and Secretary Manager.

"The more attractive things in our school are as follows:

"All teaching materials are available from the sponsors. Buildings are attractive due to the colorful paints and drawings. Good environment full of the trees. We gets delicious food, green vegetables and safe water. Our school behavior in this area is well conducted and well due to the word of God that we teach the religion in the class. Also we have monthly prayer so that we pray for the sponsors, parents, pupils and teachers together with other workers. We are growing up to the high class of teaching (a good level of academic) compare to other school in this village.

"My Family is going well due to benefits which I have got from this school by doing as I am appointed. I pray for all sponsors who sponsored our school and our children."
