**Here's Patrick's story of Samwel Wilson Sarakikya:** "He lives in Sakila Village. His father is called Wilson Sangito Sarakikya. His mother is called Sara Wilson Sarakikya. They are Peasants [farmers]. Mr. and Mrs. Wilson have eight children. 3 are boys and 5 are girls. There are 10 members in their family. Samwel is 7th born in their family. The last born is called Dorcas. She is in class two in public school. The first born in their family is a girl, her name is Jessica. She is a porter [support staff to climbers of Kilimanjaro]. All of the children in this family did not get Secondary Education excepting Jessica who ended form four [last grade of secondary school]. May be was due to poor education in public school. I think there is a hope for Samwel to go on with higher Education according to his performance. Last year in annual exam Samwel was the second among fifty two students in their class. In the subjects of English and History was the first. Samwel wants to be a Lawyer one day. When we asked him about their family which is poor he said that he will assist them to get better life like having good shelter, dairy cattle and so forth. He is very thankful to you sponsors.
